The Sheboygan Police Department has had a K-9 program since 1989. The K-9 Unit has proven to be an important tool utilized by the police to combat crime and build community relations. As current SPD K-9's retire, it is the department's goal to continue to provide this significant service to the citizens of Sheboygan. The current cost of outfitting a K-9 team (officer, K-9, vehicle, etc.) is approximately \$75,000 and is not traditionally funded governmentally. Your police department's goal is to seek assistance from the community in order to raise funds to place two K-9 Units into service in 2018.



• Canines detect and locate illegal drugs that have been concealed.

- Canines track down criminals who have fled the scene.
- Canines search for missing persons.
- Canines are valuable partners at community presentations.
